

The lake of fire is called the "second death" because death has already been experienced physically, but this is the eternal **judgment** of death. Some teachers have advocated the doctrine of "annihilation" saying that there is no eternal punishment of the unsaved. However, it is clear that God has chosen not to tamper with the human will nor destroy the human soul. Where a person chooses to spend eternity is up to him, but his consciousness will exist forever.
