(Reading the text aloud is of great value.)

Set aside a specific scheduled time if possible, and work on your study daily. If you lay it aside for too long, you will lose the flow and continuity of the lesson.

As you complete each lesson or chapter, mentally summarize what you have just learned.

Other helps such as commentaries or devotional books can add greater depth to your studies.
