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Pray before you begin and ask the Lord to enlighten your spiritual understanding.

Read the question carefully and then read the Bible text at least twice.

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SYNOPTIC GOSPELS I

The Gospels of Matthew, Mark and Luke are collectively called the synoptic gospels, which means to "see or view together". Therefore, these first three gospels are very similar, both in content and also in the emphasis they place on certain subjects. All three emphasize the Galilean ministry of Christ, His public life, and His humanity. They also contain His teachings in parable form. These similarities contrast with the Gospel of John which harmonizes in content with the other gospels, yet takes a very different approach in narration.

Together, Matthew and Luke contain almost all of the information in the Gospel of Mark. However, Matthew and Luke also have additional material which is common to them but not contained in Mark.

Each gospel was written from the author's own point of view and with a different purpose in mind. Matthew presents Christ as the King and was written mainly for the Jews. Mark was written for the Romans in particular, and its theme is Christ the Servant. Luke is the longest and most complete gospel. Luke was a Gentile and wrote principally for the Greeks. He emphasizes the perfect humanity of Christ, presenting Him as the Son of Man. Luke is also the most historical and biographical of the three gospels.

Remember, two or more people seeing the same thing report it according to the detail that most impressed them. This is why Matthew, Mark and Luke may give different pictures of the same incident.

Before answering the questions in each section, please read and compare all scripture references carefully.

I. INTRODUCTION

Read Luke 1:1-4, 3:23b-38; Mark 1:1; Matthew 1:1-17.

Luke introduces his gospel by stating his reason for writing it.

- Many had written about the deeds that had been accomplished during Christ's earthly ministry. Who told them of these things in the first place? Luke 1:2
 - Eyewitnesses
 - Ministers
- Why did Luke write to Theophilus? v. 4 Paul wants Him to know the Gospel he's been taught is true.
- Mark's introduction is brief and to the point. He tells us that this is "the beginning of _____ Gospel, (Good News) of Jesus Christ _____". v. 1

Matthew opens his gospel with a genealogy of Jesus, which descends from Abraham forward through Joseph, the foster father of Jesus. The genealogy in Luke 3:23b-38 traces His line backward through His mother Mary to Adam. Both of these accounts are very important, each one showing that Jesus was the Son of David and was the fulfillment of prophecy. In Matthew the royal and legal line is shown, and in Luke the biological or human line is shown.

II. CIRCUMSTANCES OF BIRTH & EARLY YEARS OF JESUS & JOHN THE BAPTIST

A. Announcements

Read Luke 1:5-56 and Matthew 1:18-25.

- Zacharias, who ministered at the time of King Herod, and his wife Elisabeth were Righteous and Blameless before God. Luke 1:6

When Elisabeth's son was born, she and Zacharias were faithful to name him John as commanded by the angel. They also had him circumcised the eighth day fulfilling the Abrahamic covenant. (Read Genesis 17:6-14.)

C. Infancy and Boyhood of Jesus

Read Matthew 2:1-23 and Luke 2:41-52.

Very little is known of the boyhood and youth of Jesus, but Luke 2:41-52 records a small portion. Answer the next four questions from this account.

In this scene is the first clear manifestation of the Trinity: The **Father** speaks while the **Spirit** descends upon the **Son**.

45. After His baptism Jesus was led into the wilderness to suffer temptation. How many days and nights did He fast? Matthew 4:2 40

If Jesus, who is perfect and who is our example, fasted, then fasting should be a part of every Christian life.

Satan's threefold approach to Jesus in the wilderness is parallel to the temptation of Eve in the Garden of Eden. Read Genesis 3:6. The appeal was to the lust of the flesh (good for food), the lust of the eyes (pleasant to behold), and the pride of life (make one wise). This same principle was involved in the wilderness temptation. Satan tried to get Jesus to use His power to feed Himself (lust of the flesh), to question God (pride of life), and to accept worldly kingdoms in disobedience to God (lust of the eyes). He even tried to use the Word against Jesus (unsuccessfully) as he had done against Eve (successfully). In short, Jesus suffered every form of temptation that comes against man and so is equipped to be our sympathetic and understanding High Priest.

The final outcome for Jesus was complete victory, achieved when He was in His weakest condition and in the worst possible circumstances. This outcome is in contrast to Adam and Eve who suffered total defeat while in perfect physical condition and in the best possible environment. Through Adam all men were lost; Through Jesus all are given an opportunity to be saved.

In the parables of the cloths and the wineskins Jesus illustrates the ending of the old and the beginning of the new. The old and the new will not mix. The law was good and had its place, but now "the kingdom of heaven is at hand." That the Pharisees did not have the eyes to see or the hearts to receive is proven by what happened on the sabbath.

As Jesus began to preach and teach to the multitude, His main theme concerned the Kingdom of God. He began the Sermon on the Mount with the Beatitudes. (The Beatitudes literally means "the blessed"; blessed is defined as "made happy".) Jesus' concept of being blessed is entirely different from the world's concept of happiness.

As Jesus entered Capernaum He was asked to heal the servant of a centurion (Matthew 8:1-13 and Luke 7:1-10). Jesus was amazed at the centurion's faith because he believed that if Jesus only spoke the word it would be done.

In Matthew 11:7-19 and Luke 7:18-35, Jesus speaks of John and confirms his ministry as recorded in Malachi 3:1. John is great because he prepared the way for Jesus and opened the door for the kingdom of God. However, John was not able to enter into the fullness of the dispensation of the Holy Spirit, for he was the bridge between the end of the old and the beginning of the new.

Jesus shows the contrast between His ministry and John's and says that neither had been accepted by the world.

By teaching with parables, Jesus was hiding the **mysteries** of the kingdom, but not the **fact** of it. Those with hardened hearts and eyes would be sifted out from the true seekers. To His disciples, who were in the kingdom, He revealed the truths behind the story.

The parable of the sower is explained as the seed (word) of the kingdom being sown in the earth with the results that follow.

If anything is hidden (mysteries of the kingdom) it will be revealed to those who have the spiritual eyes and ears to see and hear. Read Proverbs 25:2. Jesus immediately knows the touch or demand of faith, as opposed to all other demands pressed upon Him.

139. What did Jesus say to Jairus? Mark 5:36 Do not fear only believe

140. As Jesus continued on, which three disciples did He allow to accompany Him? Mark 5:37

141. When Jesus took the girl by the hand and spoke to her, what happened? Mark 5:42 she immediately got up and began walking

Jesus then returned to His hometown and taught once again in the synagogue. There He found much the same reaction as was studied in Luke 4:22--the people were amazed at His wisdom and the miracles He had performed. However, instead of being filled with awe and reverence, they were offended because He was the "carpenter's son". Jesus could do very little there because of their hard hearts.

142. What did Jesus marvel at? Mark 6:6 because of their unbelief

143. Jesus continued to minister, and after looking at the multitudes with compassion what did He say to His disciples? Matthew 9:37 The harvest is plentiful but the laborer are few

This same charge holds true today. Few are willing to **labor**.

F. **The Twelve Commissioned and Sent Out**

Read Matthew 10:1-11:1, 14:1-12; Mark 6:7-30; Luke 9:1-10.

144. When Jesus called the disciples to Him, what authority did He give them? Matthew 10:1 over unclean spirits to cast them out, to heal every disease/affliction

145. To whom were the disciples sent? Matthew 10:6 to the lost sheep of the house of Israel.

The twelve were not to go to the Gentiles until the Jews had first received their opportunity to accept the King.

146. The disciples were to give in the same manner in which they had received, which was Freely. Matthew 10:8

147. What were they to take with them? Matthew 10:9-10 nothing/ just the gospel

148. What determined whether or not they stayed in a particular house? Matthew 10:11-13 if their peace was received.

149. What were they to do if they were not accepted in a house or a city? Matthew 10:14 wipe off the dust
A time of judgment was pronounced upon those who rejected God's messengers.

Verses 16-39 are an excellent discourse on the cost of discipleship. Jesus left us no room to ever be "surprised" by the difficulties and trials of true discipleship.

150. Disciples are as sheep among wolves. v. 16

151. When delivered up for the sake of the Lord, who will speak through God's disciples? Matthew 10:17-20 But it is the spirit of Your Father who speaks through you
152. Who shall be saved? Matthew 10:22 the one who endures until the end
 Verses 24-27 tell us that even though the followers of Christ cannot expect better treatment than Jesus received, we are still to proclaim that which we have learned.
153. We should not fear the one who can kill the body, but who should we fear? Matthew 10:28 the one that after killing the body has power to cast the soul in hell
154. Each person is so important to God that the hairs of your head are #Matthew 10:30
155. What does the confession of Jesus before the Father depend upon? Matthew 10:32-33 acknowledging Jesus before men

The next few verses clearly reveal that the first and foremost love of every Christian must be for God. Putting anyone or anything else above Him makes us unworthy.

156. How can we find our life? Matthew 10:39 by losing our life
 At this point in Christ's ministry, the full story of the imprisonment and death of John the Baptist is given. The story is told now because upon seeing power demonstrated through Christ and His disciples, King Herod was troubled by his conscience. Turn to Mark 6:16-29.
157. When Herod heard of Jesus, who did he think He was? Mark 6:16 John who he beheaded
158. Why did Herod put John in prison? Mark 6:17-18 for the sake of Herodias his brothers wife whom he had married.
159. What did Herod promise to the daughter of Herodias? Mark 6:23 what ever you ask of me i will give you up too half my kingdom
160. What did she ask for? Mark 6:25 the head of John the baptist on a platter
161. Was it given to her? Mark 6:28 yes

V. **The Multitude Fed and the Sea Conquered**

But God says, "Honor your father and mother".

173. Where do the evil things that defile a man come from? Mark 7:21 from the heart of man
174. When the Syrophenician woman came for help Jesus told her, in effect, that this "bread" was for the Jews first and not for others. What did she answer? Mark 7:28
Even the dogs under the table get the crumbs
175. How do we know that Jesus honored her faith? Mark 7:30 the demon was gone out of the child
176. Who did Jesus deliver after leaving Tyre and Sidon? Mark 7:31-37 the deaf mute man
177. Before the feeding of the second multitude, how much food did Jesus begin with? Matthew 15:34 seven loaves and a few small fishes
178. How much was left over? Matthew 15:37 seven baskets full
179. How many had been fed? Matthew 15:38 four thousand besides women and kids
180. Once again the Pharisees came asking for a sign and were refused (Matthew 16:1-4). After Jesus departed from them, He warned the disciples against the leaven of the Pharisees. What did He mean? Matthew 16:12 beware of the teachings of the pharisees
181. At Bethsaida how many times did Jesus lay hands on the blind man before he saw clearly? Mark 8:22-26 two times
 Jesus heals using different means and methods according to need and circumstances. Healing may be immediate, or it may cover a period of time.

(Christ means Messiah or Anointed One.)
184. When Jesus began to speak to the disciples of His death and resurrection, what did Peter do? Mark 8:32 he began to rebuke Jesus
185. Jesus rebuked Peter reproaching him for not savoring the things of God, but rather the things of Man. Mark 8:33
186. What three things must be done in order to serve Christ? Mark 8:34
a. deny Himself b. take up his cross
c. and follow me
187. Six days after Jesus' statement that some would not "taste of death", He took three of the disciples up to a mountain. Who were they? Mark 9:2
a. Peter b. James c. John

In the transfiguration the very essence of what Jesus was inwardly shone forth through His body. His complete purity, holiness and perfection illuminated Him until His garments were shining and whiter than snow.

195. What problem was Jesus confronted with when He came down from the mountain? Mark 9:17
a mute child from a spirit
196. Why were the disciples unable to bring deliverance to this boy? Matt. 17:20 little faith
197. What is required in order to bring forth this type of deliverance? Matthew 17:21 (KJV)
a. fasting b. prayer
198. As they came to Capernaum and had to pay tribute, where did Jesus tell them to get the tax money? Matthew 17:27 out of the mouth of the first fish they caught

199. When the disciples argued over who should be the greatest in the kingdom, what did Jesus say was necessary to enter in? Matthew 18:3 to become as little children

The scriptural instruction to be childlike refers to innocence, trust, love, and lack of malice. This condition is entirely different than childishness which denotes selfishness, immaturity, etc.

200. Jesus gives an emphatic warning against being a stumbling block. He illustrates the importance by saying that we should cut off our hand or pluck out our eye if they offend us. Matthew 18:8-9

When we realize how valuable or useful a right hand or eye is to us, we will see the severity of this message.

201. What three successive steps should be taken if a brother trespasses? Matthew 18:15-17
a. meet with him just you two b. take people with you and meet
c. have the church deal with it

If a brother hears at any one of these points, then he has been gained back (sin separates from God). If he will not hear, then he is put out of fellowship by the church until such a time as he repents.

202. How many times should we forgive our brother? Matthew 18:22 70 x 7. (unlimited)

In other words, as many times as forgiveness is asked, it should be granted. Verses 23-35 give an illustration showing the importance of forgiveness. Our part is to be very careful not to offend or to be a stumbling block and yet to be very quick to forgive others.

203. As Jesus set His face toward Jerusalem and the cross, a certain Samaritan village would not receive Him. What did John and James want to do to the people? Luke 9:54
call fire from heaven and consume them.

Although the disciples were displaying loyalty, it was with the wrong spirit--the spirit of destruction. In contrast, at that very moment Jesus was on His way to give Himself so that all might have life--the spirit of the cross.
