(Reading the text aloud is of great value.)

Work on your study regularly. If you lay it aside, you will lose the flow and continuity of the lesson.

As you complete each lesson or chapter, mentally summarize what you have just learned.

Other helps such as commentaries or devotional books can add greater depth to your studies.

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THE PERSON AND WORK OF THE HOLY SPIRIT

The Holy Spirit is the Third Person of the Trinity. As God, He is eternal, without beginning and without end. Read I John 5:7.

I. THE HOLY SPIRIT IN THE OLD TESTAMENT

The Holy Spirit in the Old Testament is described as being active in the Creation in Genesis 1:2, "And the Spirit of God moved upon the face of the waters." The presence and the workings of the Holy Spirit can be seen throughout the Old Testament. After reading the following scriptures, describe the work or purpose of the Holy Spirit in each case.

1. Ex. 31:3-11 3 And I have filled him with the spirit of God, in wisdom, and in understanding, and in knowledge, and in all manner of workmanship
2. Num. 11:14-17 they shall bear the burden of the people with thee, that thou bear it not thyself alone. Power to Lead and Make wise rulings, Holy Judgement.
3. Judges 3:9,10 and his hand prevailed. the power to prevail in battle
4. Judges 6:6, 12, 34 & chap. 7 fights for us in battle and prevails
5. Judges 11:29,32 and the Lord delivered them into his hands.
The power to prevail in battle against greater odds
6. Judges 13:24, 25; 14:6, 19 supernatural strength, and the power to overcome in battle
7. Judges 15:14, 15 Might like Samson

These preceding scriptures indicate the presence of the Holy Spirit coming upon individuals in order that they might accomplish certain divinely commissioned tasks such as the deliverance of God's people. The emphasis appears to be placed upon the task to be accomplished rather than upon the desire of the individual to be filled with the Spirit of God. Although God's power is not given because we live a holy life and deserve His blessings, a holy life and separation from the world are necessary to maintain the Holy Spirit's presence in our lives. Many things can be learned from the life of Samson.
