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# GENESIS

Within the fifty chapters of the book of Genesis, we find the beginning of every major stream of truth in the Word of God. Genesis has been rightly called “the seed plot of the whole Bible”. The name Genesis is a Greek word that means beginning or origin. In this book, we have God’s record of the beginning of three basic avenues of truth that are followed and thoroughly developed throughout the entire Bible.

1. The Creation and origin of all life, including human life.
2. The destruction of that life through the interruption of sin.
3. God’s plan to rid this creation of the intruding element of sin.

Understanding the beginning of these and other basic truths provides for us a solid foundation of faith.

## CHAPTER 1 - READ THE CHAPTER FIRST

1. In which part of **time** does verse one start? In the beginning

“In the beginning” God, who has no beginning, created the heavens and the earth. It was in the heart of our wonderful God to create a planet with walking, talking, singing, moving, flying and growing **life** on it. Each creature with its fur, feathers, colors, noises and abilities would be an expression of God Himself. At first the earth was without real form and there was only darkness and water. The Spirit of God moved upon the face of the waters, and God said, “Let there be light”.

In the six spaces provided below, write what God created on each of the six days of creation.

2. God said, Let there be light: and there was light.
3. God made the firmament, and divided the waters which were under the firmament from the waters which were above the firmament
4. God called the dry land Earth; and the gathering together of the waters called he Seas God said, Let the earth bring forth grass, the herb yielding seed, and the fruit tree yielding fruit after his kind, whose seed is in itself
5. God said, Let there be lights in the firmament of the heaven to divide the day from the night; and let them be for signs, and for seasons, and for days, and years
6. God said, Let the waters bring forth abundantly the moving creature that hath life, and fowl that may fly above the earth in the open firmament of heaven.
7. God said, Let the earth bring forth the living creature after his kind, cattle, and creeping thing, and beast of the earth after his kind: and it was so. God said, Let us make man in our image, after our likeness: and let them have dominion

Each day was a glorious expression of the creative mind and heart of our God. Many Bible scholars agree that each day was one day and not a geological era as some have supposed. Many have tried to harmonize the theory of evolution and God’s record of His miraculous creation. However, the Bible teaches that “the things which are seen were not made of things which do appear”. (Heb. 11:3) Life did not evolve out of itself, but was a direct result of God’s creative act.

## CHAPTER 2 - READ THE CHAPTER FIRST

The crowning act of God’s creation was the creation of man. Everything else God called into existence with His proclamation of, “Let there be....” **But when He created man and woman, He formed them Himself and breathed His own breath into them.**

From Genesis 1:26-28 and 2:7-25, list 7 facts about the creation and position of man and woman.

8. God said, Let us make man in our image, after our likeness: and let them have dominion in the image of God created he him; male and female created he them
9. the Lord God formed man of the dust of the ground
10. breathed into his nostrils the breath of life man became a living soul.
11. God took the man, and put him into the garden of Eden to dress it and to keep it.
12. Lord God said, It is not good that the man should be alone; I will make him an help meet for him
13. Adam gave names to all cattle, and to the fowl of the air, and to every beast of the field; but for Adam there was not found an help meet for him.
14. God caused a deep sleep to fall upon Adam, and he slept: and he took one of his ribs, and closed up the flesh instead thereof; 22 And the rib, which the Lord God had taken from man, made he a woman, and brought her unto the man.

And they were both naked, the man and his wife, and were not ashamed.

### CHAPTER 3 - READ THE CHAPTER FIRST

There was a great rebellion in heaven before the world was ever created. Read Isaiah 14:12-15 and Ezekiel 28:13-19. A great and beautiful angel, Lucifer, rebelled against God and was cast from his position in heaven. Now that God had created someone dear to His heart and in His own image, Lucifer became intent on tempting the man so that he (Lucifer) might strike out at God. We cannot tell how many times Lucifer may have come to Eve or Adam using many disguises in order to tempt them away from obedience and fellowship with God. God allowed Adam and Eve to be tempted so they could prove their love as responsible creatures through exercising the power of choice. Thus they would not be reduced to mere robots.

15. Speaking through the serpent, what type of statement does Satan use? \_\_\_\_\_  
He asked a question, and then made a statement in direct opposition to God.
- Many times Satan will work great destruction in our lives if he can cause us to **question and doubt**.
16. What does the devil say about the penalty God promised? he lied and said "you will not die", then he further made God out to be like himself, hungry for power and control.

Satan still tells the whole world the same message that God does not really mean what He says about the judgment of hell and eternal death.

Below are listed the three ways Eve was enticed as revealed in verse 6. From I John 2:16, write the particular lust that was satisfied.

17. It was pleasant to the eyes. The lust of the eye
18. The tree was good for food. The lust of the flesh
19. The tree would make her wise. The pride of life.. pride
20. Why do you think Adam and Eve were suddenly hiding from God? Shame. manifested physical nakedness  
They were naked spiritually, They no longer had His Spirit of Transference.

Even though Adam and Eve were naked before, suddenly they realized their nakedness and felt it. Many believe that before they sinned **they were clothed with a heavenly glory and holiness**.

21. When questioned, who did the man blame for his sin? He blamed the woman.
22. Whom did the woman blame? she blamed the serpent.

To blame someone else is the nature of man, but God holds everyone individually responsible for his own sin.

Beginning in verse 14, the Lord pronounces a curse upon four beings: 1) the serpent, 2) Satan, 3) the woman, 4) the man.

23. What did God say would happen to the serpent? thou art cursed above all cattle, and above every beast of the field; upon thy belly shalt thou go, and dust shalt thou eat all the days of thy life

In verse 15, the Lord is speaking to Satan himself. This verse is the first promise of redemption through the Lord Jesus Christ. As a result of the fall, all children are born in sin. This enmity is Jesus the Son of God born into the human race.

24. What will "the enmity", the Lord Jesus, do to Satan's head? it shall bruise thy head,  
The head signifies authority.

25. What will Satan be allowed to do to Jesus? and thou shalt bruise his heel.  
This speaks of the bruising Jesus will take on the cross for our sin.

26. What are the curses upon woman? I will greatly multiply thy sorrow and thy conception; in sorrow thou shalt bring forth children; and thy desire shall be to thy husband, and he shall rule over thee.

27. What are the curses upon man? Thou shalt not eat of it: cursed is the ground for thy sake; in sorrow shalt thou eat of it all the days of thy life; 18 Thorns also and thistles shall it bring forth to thee; and thou shalt eat the herb of the field; 19 In the sweat of thy face shalt thou eat bread, till thou return unto the ground; for out of it wast thou taken: for dust thou art, and unto dust shalt thou return.

#### CHAPTER 4 - READ THE CHAPTER FIRST

28. What was Adam's first son's name and what was his occupation? Abel. And Abel was a keeper of sheep

29. What was Adam's second son's name and what was his occupation? Cain was a tiller of the ground.

Undoubtedly, the family had been given previous instructions concerning offerings. An offering was to involve the shedding of blood through animal sacrifice.

30. What does Cain offer? Cain brought of the fruit of the ground an offering unto the Lord

31. Abel believed God's instructions and made a proper offering. What does Heb. 11:4 say was the basis for his offering? By faith Abel offered unto God

32. What is it that really pleases God? Hebrews 11:6 without faith it is impossible to please him: for he that cometh to God must believe that he is, and that he is a rewarder of them that diligently seek him  
Cain disobeyed God's instructions and brought his own kind of offering. Many people today assume that if they don't hurt anyone and that if they go to church once in awhile, surely God will accept them. God's path of salvation begins at the cross. The only acceptable offering for our sin is the blood of Jesus Christ.

33. How did God try to reason with Cain? v. 7 If thou doest well, shalt thou not be accepted?

34. What did Cain finally do? v. 8 Cain rose up against Abel his brother, and slew him. He was Jealous because Able's offering was accepted.

35. What does 1 John 3:12,13 say Cain's reason was? Because his own works were evil, and his brother's righteous.
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36. What is the lesson we are to learn from this passage in 1 John 3? Marvel not, my brethren, if the world hate you. Don't expect that people will like you because you follow righteousness, the opposite is true.
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37. What is the Lord's answer to Cain's question in verse 3, and what is our responsibility toward others? 1 John 3:16 Cain and to his offering The Lord had not respect because he laid down his life for us: and we ought to lay down our lives for the brethren.
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38. What would Cain be all the rest of his life? vv. 12,14 a fugitive and a vagabond shalt thou be in the earth.
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## CHAPTER 5 - READ THE CHAPTER FIRST

Man originally was created to live forever and death came as a result of sin. We see in chapter five that man's life span was much longer than it is now. Sin obviously had not yet taken its full toll in the human body. **It is the mercy of God upon the human race that now limits the number of years men have to corrupt themselves through sin and wickedness.**

- How many years did each of the following people live? Seth were nine hundred and twelve years  
 Mahalaleel were eight hundred ninety and five years
39. Adam nine hundred and thirty years 40. Cainan nine hundred and ten years
41. Enos nine hundred and five years 42. Jared nine hundred sixty and two years
43. What happened to Enoch? v. 24; (see Heb. 11:5) the days of Enoch were three hundred sixty and five years:

24 And Enoch walked with God: and he was not; for God took him. Enoch was translated that he should not see death; and was not found, : for before his translation he had this testimony, that he pleased God.

Enoch had such a close relationship with God that only after 365 years of living in this world, the Lord translated him into heaven. Many people will complain that, because they must work or live among the unsaved, they cannot maintain a close relationship with God. We will see in the next chapter that Enoch lived in the midst of the greatest wickedness and unrestrained iniquity the world has ever seen ... yet he truly walked with God!

44. What great future event did Enoch see? Jude 14,15 Behold, the Lord cometh with ten thousands of his saints, 15 To execute judgment upon all, and to convince all that are ungodly among them of all their ungodly deeds which they have ungodly committed, and of all their hard speeches which ungodly sinners have spoken against him.

## CHAPTER 6 - READ THE CHAPTER FIRST

Many fundamental Bible scholars and teachers agree that life upon the earth was approximately a mere 1600-1800 years old when the events of chapter six began.

45. After this comparatively short time, what was man's condition and what were the constant thoughts of his heart? v. 5 the wickedness of man was great in the earth, and that every imagination of the thoughts of his heart was only evil continually.
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The intermarriage of the "daughters of men" and the "sons of God" (v. 1,2,4) is mentioned as an example of the extreme wickedness of the day. The identity of these "sons of God" has been a matter of dispute. Some students think they were godly Sethites (Gen. 4:25,26). Others believe they were fallen angelic beings in human form. We may not know exactly what took place; however, as we approach the end of the Church Age and things are "as it was in the days of Noah", we can see there certainly is an increasing and unholy interest in spirits, demons, and their activities.

46. When sin reached such a peak, what was God's attitude and decision? vv. 3,6,7 My spirit shall not always strive with man, for that he also is flesh: yet his days shall be an hundred and twenty years. the Lord said, I will destroy  
man whom I have created from the face of the earth; both man, and beast, and the creeping thing, and the fowls of the air; for it repenteth me that I have made them.
47. What is the main element that filled the earth? vv. 11-13 \_\_\_\_\_  
 The earth also was corrupt before God, and the earth was filled with violence.

Current events indicate that things are "as it was in the days of Noah" with riots, demonstrations, shootings, assassinations and mass murders increasing at an alarming rate. The people of Noah's day had 120 years to prepare themselves and make their hearts right with God. Today there is not that much time left for our generation; however, there has been an "ark" prepared for our salvation. Jesus Christ is this "ark".

48. How long was the ark? 450 ft I find it amazing that these sizes equate to whole numbers in feet.
49. How wide was the ark? 75ft

## CHAPTER 7 - READ THE CHAPTER FIRST

51. When Noah finished building the ark, what did God say to him? Come thou and all thy house into the ark;  
for thee have I seen righteous before me in this generation.2 Of every clean beast thou shalt take to thee by sevens, the male and his female: and of beasts that are not clean by two, the male and his female.
52. How many days was Noah in the ark before the promised rain came? seven days
53. How long did the rain last? forty days and forty nights
54. Who shut Noah in the ark? the Lord shut him in.
55. What died upon the face of the earth? v. 23 All in whose nostrils was the breath of life, of all that was in the dry land, died. 23 And every living substance was destroyed

## CHAPTER 8 - READ THE CHAPTER FIRST

56. What did God use to begin to dry up the waters? v. 1 God made a wind to pass over the earth, and the waters assuaged;
57. In the seventh month, 150 days later, where did the ark rest? upon the mountains of Ararat.
58. How long was the ark there before the waters receded enough to see the tops of other mountains? vv. 4,5 in the tenth month, on the first day of the month, were the tops of the mountains seen.
59. After another 40 days, what did Noah send out? he sent forth a raven, which went forth to and fro
60. What did the dove return with and what did it mean to Noah? an olive leaf plucked off: so Noah knew that the waters were abated from off the earth.

After a total of 370 days Noah looked and saw dry ground. What a thrilling and yet eerie sight! Noah knew he and his family were the only people on the face of the earth.



61. After all left the ark, what was the first thing Noah did? Noah builded an altar unto the Lord; and took of every clean beast, and of every clean fowl, and offered burnt offerings on the altar.

Noah's heart was fully set upon the Lord!

## CHAPTER 9 - READ THE CHAPTER FIRST

When the Lord sent Noah forth to begin life on the earth again, He reestablished some very basic standards of life.

62. Does the Lord believe in capital punishment? Yes Which verse says so? 5 and 6
63. What is the covenant (agreement) God made with man? neither shall all flesh be cut off any more by the waters of a flood; neither shall there any more be a flood to destroy the earth.
64. What would be His token or sign that He would never destroy the earth like this again? \_\_\_\_\_  
I do set my bow in the cloud, and it shall be for a token of a covenant between me and the earth.

The rainbow is not something that "just happened". It is a direct creative act of God that speaks of a promise He made to man. If we will be faithful to God through every stormy time of trial and temptation, we will always see that He has a rainbow of promise at the end. (See Job 23:10; Romans 8:18; Hebrews 12:11.)

65. Even though the Lord will not destroy the earth with water again, what will He do? II Peter 3:10-13  
heavens being on fire shall be dissolved, and the elements shall melt with fervent heat

One day Noah was found in a drunken state by his three sons. This scene is important because from these three men come forth all the races of the world. Their reactions to their father's weakness would determine the course of their lives and the nations that each represented.

66. What are the 3 sons' names as given in v. 18? a. Shem  
b. Ham c. Japheth
67. How long after the flood did Noah live? 350 years he died at the age of 950years.. He was approx 325years old when he began, since all three sons were already born, it took him about 75 years to build it.

## CHAPTERS 10 & 11 - READ THE CHAPTERS FIRST

The Bible recorded careful genealogies because someday the Son of God would be born into the human race. Among these names are both good and bad men. Nimrod, in his day, was like a false Christ who began a false religious cult. The root of all false worship today can actually be traced back to Nimrod's kingdom at Babel or Babylon.

68. What was Nimrod said to be? a mighty one in the earth. and a mighty hunter before the Lord.

"A mighty hunter" shows he was a man of great accomplishment and skill in the eyes of men. False teachers and leaders down through the years have often been men of great strength and skill. The one world ruler Antichrist, who will rise to power in the last days, will be the greatest "Nimrod" the world has ever seen. (Daniel 8:23-25; II Thess. 2:2-4,9) In chapter 11 we read that at this time there was only one spoken language upon the earth, and therefore Nimrod was able to unify the earth in one common evil cause.

69. What did they want to build at Babel? A great tower to reach heaven.

side note: 12 And Resen between Nineveh and Calah: the same is a great city. (Nineveh is actient. )

5 By these were the isles of the Gentiles divided in their lands; every one after his tongue, after their families, and their nations. the end of Pangea?

God wants man to reach heaven but not by his own strength and efforts. By building the tower of Babel, man exhibited his rebellion and self-sufficiency. His efforts, as they always do, ended in failure.

70. All false religions and other spiritual paths give some credit to man's efforts, but what does God want to eliminate? Eph. 2:8,9 For by grace are ye saved through faith; and that not of yourselves: it is the gift of God:9 Not of works, lest any man should boast.

71. How did the Lord stop the building of the tower? He confused every ones language

In the end times, the whole world will try to unite together once again under the Antichrist.

72. In the book of Revelation, what is the woman's name who represents the one-world religious political system of the last days? Rev. 17:1-5 Mystery, Babylon The Great, The Mother Of Harlots And Abominations Of The Earth.

73. At the end of this age, the world will unite together once again. How will the Lord confound men's evil plan the next time? Rev. 19:11-21 These both were cast alive into a lake of fire burning with brimstone.  
21 And the remnant were slain with the sword of him that sat upon the horse, which sword proceeded out of his mouth: and all the fowls were filled with their flesh.

## CHAPTER 12 - READ THE CHAPTER FIRST

In chapter twelve there is a very important turning point in God's plan for mankind. God begins the creation of the nation that would be His own chosen people upon the earth.

74. Using the following verses, name three things the Lord wanted His people to be. Exodus 19:5,6,10; Deut. 26:18,19; Deut. 28:9,10

- a. Obey God and His Commandments
- b. Walk in Holiness
- c. Be sanctified unto the Lord

75. What was the Lord's call to Abram? vv. 1-3 Get thee out of thy country, and from thy kindred, and from thy father's house... I will make of thee a great nation... I will bless them that bless thee, and curse him that curseth thee: and in thee shall all families of the earth be blessed.

76. Summarize what the Lord's call is to us today. II Cor. 6:14-18; Luke 14:33 Be ye not unequally yoked together with unbelievers.... come out from among them, and be ye separate.... touch not the unclean thing.... whosoever he be of you that forsaketh not all that he hath, he cannot be my disciple.

77. Besides Sarai his wife, who did Abram allow to go with him? Lot went with him

78. People often assume that once they start following God, everything will be easy. What was the first thing to happen to Abram in the land where God led him? v. 10 there was a famine in the land

79. Where did Abram go when hard times came? Abram went down into Egypt to sojourn there  
Did God tell him to go there? No, but God greatly increased Abram there, he came in poor but left rich.

God had called Abram to journey to Canaan. Abram was learning that we don't follow the Lord just when things are going well or when everything seems right. Had Abram remained faithful to God, He would have wonderfully provided for him and blessed him. Instead Abram looked to man for help and



ended up being caught in a lie in Egypt. When we stray from God's will, things can only go from bad to worse until we return to the place that He has called us.

80. What was Abram's lie? The lie of omission, He didn't tell them Saria was his wife, he didn't lie about the sister part
81. How did the Lord take care of Abram's failure? He became very rich while in Egypt, also, God protected Him and his marriage by sending a plague, God also gave the knowledge to pharaoh that it was because of Sarai being married to Abram

### CHAPTER 13 - READ THE CHAPTER FIRST

82. What finally happened to Lot? vv. 8-11 He had to separate from Abram, who tried to give him land, but then God told Abram, "to the have I given this land". Also, Lot pitched toward Sodom, eventually Lot loses his wealth after leaving.
83. Lot wasn't concerned about pleasing God; where did he choose to live? v. 10 The plains of Jordan  
Good to note here, that this land was, "like the garden of God, and Like Egypt". It could have been God's Blessing, but but it reminded Lot of where he came from, so he possibly wanted to return.
84. Summarize what God said to Abram after he and Lot separated. \_\_\_\_\_  
To the I have given this land, and to your seed, as many as the sand of the sea.

### CHAPTER 14 - READ THE CHAPTER FIRST

85. What happened to Lot as a result of this battle? v. 12 He and his riches were carried away
86. How was he delivered? vv. 14-16 Abram went after him to rescue him, It is interesting to note that here Lot is called Abrams Brother. This family unit is a little confusing as Lot is both Abrams brother and his nephew, and Saria is both Abram's Wife and sister. I think Lot had Abram had different fathers, and Saria and him different Mothers.
- Actually Abram never should have had to fight this battle for Lot. Our own mistakes and failure to obey God will often lead us to unnecessary battles. However, God is faithful; He not only gives us victory but uses all of these battles to minister to us. Beginning in verse 17, we have an interesting picture of the Lord's faithfulness to deliver us from temptation. As Abram returned from the battle, the wicked King of Sodom went out to meet him to make an ungodly bargain with Abram. Before this wicked king met Abram, the Lord sent a man named Melchizedek to minister to him.
87. What did Melchizedek do for Abram? That God had given him the victory, and that he, Abram, is called of God. Melchizedek is believed by most theologians to be Jesus, pre incarnate.

88. How did Abram respond? He gave tithes, I believe this is the first time it is called a tithe. 10% holy to God.
- This is the first record of **tithing**, a scriptural principle found throughout the Word of God. Some people have challenged tithing saying that it is part of the Law and that we are not under the Law. However, this scene clearly shows that **tithing was part of God's plan before the Law was ever given**, and therefore is God's principle with or **without the Law!**

89. The King of Sodom then tried to bargain with Abram, but what was his response? \_\_\_\_\_  
No... He would not lest he say that it was this king and not God who provided for Abram. Also, this king wanted the people, as part of the trade, I believe that Abram protected the people, in so doing.

Abram refused his offer. He wanted God to receive all the glory for the victory.

This man Melchizedek is seen as a type of the Lord Jesus Christ. (Hebrews chapter 7) Although Melchizedek was not part of the regular priesthood, he blessed Abram and received his tithes. Also the Lord Jesus was not part of the earthly priesthood, yet is the Blessor of all mankind and the One to whom all our tithes should be offered. Melchizedek's life typifies the True High Priest, Jesus!

90. Read all of Hebrews 7. When you have read it very carefully, check the box. [x]

## CHAPTER 15 - READ THE CHAPTER FIRST

God had made wonderful promises to Abram about a great nation that would come forth from his own family, but as yet Abram did not even have one child. Abram questioned God thinking that the steward of his household would be his heir.

91. What did God say to this? your heir will come out of your own bowels. Remember Abram was over 75 here, Sarai was about 65 at this time. She at 65 was very beautiful.

Many times when God's promise for us doesn't come to pass as we think it should, we start planning how we might help God bring it to pass. If we are not careful, we will end up settling for a substitute instead of God's perfect will for our lives. God's plan for us is always **much** greater than our greatest substitute plan. God wasn't just thinking about one son but a whole nation.

92. What did the Lord tell Abram to look at and why? v. 5 now toward heaven, and tell the stars, if thou be able to number them

Abram believed such a fantastic promise, and yet he wanted some kind of confirmation from the Lord. The Lord requested that Abram lay out various sacrifices and then He would answer by fire. This is a beautiful picture of waiting upon the Lord, even struggling if necessary, until we hear from heaven.

93. What did Abram do in verse 11? when the fowls came down upon the carcasses, Abram drove them away.

94. As New Testament believers, what are our spiritual battles and struggles in prayer? Eph. 6:12  
12 For we wrestle not against flesh and blood, but against principalities, against powers, against the rulers of the darkness of this world, against spiritual wickedness in high places.

95. What was the darkness like for Abram just before God responded? v. 12 an horror of great darkness fell upon him.

The Lord then spoke to Abram and gave him great insight into the future of the nation that would be his seed. These verses speak of the 400 years Israel would spend in Egypt.

96. Was God faithful to answer His diligent servant? Yes

97. What does God always reward? Heb. 11:6 Faith...  
But without faith it is impossible to please him: for he that cometh to God must believe that he is, and that he is a rewarder of them that diligently seek him.

## CHAPTER 16 - READ THE CHAPTER FIRST

Abram had now been in the Promised Land ten years and had begun to weaken in his commitment to the promises of God. Sarai had also become impatient and suggested the wrong idea at the wrong time.

98. What did Sarai suggest? v. 2 go in unto my maid; it may be that I may obtain children by her,,, is this like Eve saying that the fruit is good to eat?? Abram was 86 years old, and Sarai was 76 when Ismael was born...

99. What happened between Sarai and Hagar? v. 4 her mistress was despised in her eyes // Hagar was in competition with Saria

Abram and the entire nation of Israel were to reap the fruit of this mistake for years to come. This son of Hagar became the Arab nation that would persecute Israel. The Arab and Israel conflict actually began at this point in history.

100. What did the angel of the Lord tell Hagar to do? v. 9 Return to thy mistress, and submit thyself under her hands. This is confusing a little because later God tells him to do what Saria wants and Cast her out, even after Hagar had obeyed God, Returned and Submitted to Saria, She was still cast out, I can't explain this.

## CHAPTER 17 - READ THE CHAPTER FIRST

Thirteen years passed before Abram received the wonderful reassuring experience of chapter 17.

101. How many "I wills" does the Lord say to Abram in verses 1-8? Seven

The Lord even changed Abram's name to Abraham, so that every time he heard his name, he would recall the promise God had made to him. God's promise to Abraham refers to nations, not just Israel. The faith covenant that began with Abraham would include the New Testament Church, which would be a part of every nation of the world. (Read Romans 4:12-18.)

As a definite mark of faith, the Lord initiates the practice of circumcision with His servant Abraham. This cutting away of the flesh on all males who were committed to God was only a picture of the spiritual commitment that would be required of God's people.

Abraham was still trusting in his own substitute plan, (Ishmael) as we can see by his cry in verse 18.

In this chapter, we are allowed to look into a very sacred experience between God and His servant Abraham. It was undoubtedly through this experience that Jesus could say what He did in John 8:56.

Even though Abraham had waited so long for Isaac and he meant so much to him, Abraham manifested clearly that God was absolutely first in his life and that he fully trusted the ways of God.

God Stopped Abraham, just before he plunged the knife.

God was able to teach Abraham the great "law of substitution". **All of us are saved through the substitution of Jesus Christ.**

It is interesting to note that even though the whole land was his by the promise of God, Abraham still had to pay for it. Later you will read that in order to finally take the land, the Jews would fight many battles for it. As a matter of fact, the Jews are still fighting today for the land that is rightfully theirs by the promise of God! Just because the Lord has freely promised us a spiritual land of victory does not mean that we do not have to labor and battle for what is rightfully ours.

This is a picture of the call of God upon our lives. Though many people, even relatives and friends, try to influence you away from obedience to the will of God, in the end the choice is up to **you!**

This chapter is the most beautiful picture story in the Old Testament of the Holy Spirit's ministry to call out and prepare the Bride of Christ. **Though Rebekah had never seen Isaac, the servant's own graciousness spoke of how wonderful his master must be. Though we have not actually seen Jesus, the Holy Spirit's ministry to us perfectly assures us that our Bridegroom is all that He is portrayed to be.** Likewise we must travel a long journey by faith until we see our "Isaac" appear in the sky!

The story of the struggle between Esau and Jacob begins here. It is the same struggle that existed between Ishmael and Isaac, the same struggle exists today between the Arabs and the Jews. It is a picture of the struggle of flesh and spirit. **The flesh nature within us will never cease to struggle to take from us the promised land of the walk in the Spirit. So likewise Israel has always fought Arab countries for their Promised Land. Our spiritual man is the "younger" and our carnal nature is the "elder". We were first born with the human nature and our second birth was spiritual. God's pattern is that the "elder shall serve the younger," so shall we fulfill God's will and enter into the promised land of the walk in the Spirit.**

142. Why did Isaac love Esau? Because he liked the venison.. Esau was a man's man. and the first born.

Esau as the firstborn son had the birthright to the promises and blessings of God. The Lord has the right to use whom He chooses. The Lord would have shown Isaac in some way that Jacob was the son of His choice, but Jacob was a man who would not wait for God. Jacob didn't need to trick his brother out of the birthright, but instead of trusting the Lord, he was always trying to work out God's will for his life using his own strength and his own ways.

143. How did Jacob steal the birthright from Esau? Making him promises it for some of his pottage.

144. What was Esau's attitude toward the things of God? (Also see Heb. 12:16,17) \_\_\_\_\_  
He didn't count them worth anything. Until later, then it was too late.

## CHAPTER 26 - READ THE CHAPTER FIRST

Isaac lied and said Rebecca was his sister, Abraham was the brother of Sara so his was not a lie but still misleading.

Isaac had allowed his father's wells to become stopped up. Each person must keep the wells of spiritual life open and not depend upon someone else's labors.

## CHAPTER 27 - READ THE CHAPTER FIRST

Isaac shares the blame in being deceived. However, this does not justify Jacob using deceit to obtain the things of God. The Lord would have worked it out another way. Rebekah knew what was God's will; the Lord had told her before her sons were born. Neither is she justified for resorting to such devious means.

146. Summarize Rebekah's plan for Jacob. The plan was to make Jacob feel hairy by putting goats fur on him, and make him smell like the outdoors, then she cooked a goat to taste like venison (pretty hard thing to do) and make Isaac believe he was Esau. Jacob was able to steal the blessing, and his birthright. She then sent Jacob to Laban for protection.

147. In which three verses does Jacob tell outright lies? Gen 27:19,20,24. Isaac was suspicious, but???

Many people like Jacob have tried to help the work of God by resorting to deceitfulness. However, such things will never prosper. Jacob's plan to spend a few days with Laban turns out to be a long, hard twenty years. Jacob the deceiver ends up being deceived by Laban and wastes many good years trying to get out of the tangled web he and Rebekah had so carefully woven.

## CHAPTER 28 - READ THE CHAPTER FIRST

The Lord never ceases to minister to us even when we fail. Often it is in the hour of our failure that we can best hear from God.

153. Running from his own mistakes, Jacob receives a wonderful dream from the Lord. What did Jacob see in his dream? behold a ladder set up on the earth, and the top of it reached to heaven: and behold the angels of God ascending and descending on it.

13 And, behold, the Lord stood above it, and said, I am the Lord God of Abraham thy father, and the God of Isaac: the land whereon thou liest, to thee will I give it, and to thy seed;

14 And thy seed shall be as the dust of the earth, and thou shalt spread abroad to the west, and to the east, and to the north, and to the south: and in thee and in thy seed shall all the families of the earth be blessed. © Global Youth Evangelism

15 And, behold, I am with thee, and will keep thee in all places whither thou goest, and will bring thee again into this land; for I will not leave thee, until I have done that which I have spoken to thee of.

### CHAPTERS 29 & 30 - READ THE CHAPTERS FIRST

Rachel and Leah were in constant strife. They even resorted to giving Jacob their personal maids in order to have children by them. In spite of the many wrong actions, it was God's time to bring forth the 12 sons of Jacob who would be the 12 tribes of Israel. (The 12th son was not born until Rachel died. Genesis 35:16-18.)

159. How many sons did Leah have? Judah, Isaacar, Zebulun. Six Rueben, Simeon, Levi Bilhah? Two Dan and Naphtali  
 Zilpah? Two Gad and Ashur Dinah. Rachel? Two Joseph, and Benjamin.

After many years, the Lord began dealing with Jacob about returning to his land. The desire to go back and live for God as Abraham and Isaac had done began to grow in his heart.

The hand of the Lord was upon Jacob's life even though he was not walking in the fullness of God's calling upon his life. In the rest of the chapter God especially blessed Jacob in everything he did in order to help him return to the Promised Land.

### CHAPTERS 32 & 33 - READ THE CHAPTERS FIRST

If we depart from God's will, at some point we are going to have to confront the very thing that first caused us to stumble. Jacob must now face Esau.

166. How was God faithful to meet with Jacob before he faced this trial? 32:1 the angels of God met him.

In spite of Jacob's humble prayer in verses 9-12, he begins to plot and plan. How much this is like all human nature! God would have us to trust **Him** to do all the planning.

167. Briefly summarize Jacob's plan. first he divided the total group into two, sending them apart from each other, Then he put the Handmaidens with their kids first, the Leah and her kids next back, then finally him a Rachel last in long line of people.

The scene at the end of chapter 32 is a picture of a man coming to the end of himself. Jacob was left alone and the man with whom he wrestled was the Lord himself. The wrestling here probably was physical, but the true struggle took place within Jacob's spirit.

168. How long was the struggle? all night until the breaking of day.

169. To what was Jacob's name changed? Israel: for as a prince hast thou power with God and with men, and hast prevailed.

In his doubts as to whether this was really God, Jacob asked for a name. After he had received the blessing, he was **sure** he had been with God.

170. What did Jacob say about his encounter? Jacob called the name of the place Peniel: for I have seen God face to face, and my life is preserved.

In the struggle, Jacob's thigh muscle was wounded. The fact that the Lord touched his thigh means that inwardly he touched the strong part of Jacob's human nature to bring about a deep transformation.

171. What was Esau's response upon seeing his brother? Esau ran to meet him, and embraced him, and fell on his neck, and kissed him: and they wept.

## CHAPTERS 34 & 35 - READ THE CHAPTERS FIRST

Jacob's daughter fell into sin with one of the Hivite men. Jacob's sons used deceit and abused the holy covenant of circumcision in order to take revenge. The problem was that Jacob had no business in settling down among the inhabitants of the land.

From the beginning, the call of God to Abraham, Isaac and Jacob was to sojourn in the land and dwell in tents. This is a lesson to us of the dangers of getting too settled in the world. We also are called to sojourn on our way to our true home.

### CHAPTER 37 - READ THE CHAPTER FIRST

Joseph is a type or foreshadowing of the person and work of the Lord Jesus Christ. Just as the Jews hated their Messiah, the favored son of the Jewish nation, Jacob's other sons turned against Joseph. And just as the Jews sold the Lord Jesus into the hands of the Gentiles, Jacob's sons also sold Joseph. Yet, through their betrayal, Joseph became a savior to his people and even to other nations, typifying Jesus becoming Savior of the world.

179. What caused Joseph's brothers to hate him? he was favored being a child of Jacobs old age, also, the coat was extravagant, finally, Joseph kept having God dreams, God telling him that we would be a person of great honor.

180. What did the brothers do with Joseph? His brothers were going to kill him, but Reuben, saved him saying to put him in a trench, he planned to go get him out, but Judah in an attempt to save his life talked them into selling him as a slave, Reuben being the oldest, when he went back to find him gone, knew that he would get the blame, then the plan.

181. What did they present to Jacob? vv. 31,32 The plan was to present the coat with blood all over it to blame some animal for the disappearance, thus taking the responsibility away from Reuben as the oldest.

### CHAPTER 38 - READ THE CHAPTER FIRST

The Bible contains two main themes that run parallel throughout the entire narrative; the total sinfulness and weakness of man and the total grace and love of God. In this chapter both these truths are clearly revealed. One of Jacob's sons, Judah is guilty of disobedience, lying and adultery. Yet **Judah** is the father of the Jewish tribe through which the Lord Jesus would come. The children born out of the unholy relationship shown in this chapter are part of the family line leading to the birth of Christ!

182. What are the two sons' names who are born from Judah's ungodly ways? Perez (Pharez) and Zarah.

183. Matthew chapter one records the human genealogy of the Lord Jesus Christ. In which verse are Judah and his sons listed? v3 and v4

### CHAPTER 39 - READ THE CHAPTER FIRST

### CHAPTERS 40 & 41 - READ THE CHAPTERS FIRST

187. Who were the two men that had dreams? butler of the king of Egypt and his baker

188. What did Joseph ask the chief butler to do after his release? to tell Pharaoh about him because he was innocent.

189. How did Joseph get out of prison? 2 years later when the Pharaoh had a dream he needed interpreted, the butler remembered Joseph and how accurate the interpretations were that God gave him.

Joseph is an excellent type of the Lord Jesus Christ. After Christ suffered unjustly at the hands of others, He rose from the dead to become Savior of the world, offering the Bread of Life to a starving world. Likewise, after Joseph's unjust betrayal into prison, he was raised to a higher position, becoming the man to whom the whole world must come for food.

### CHAPTERS 42 - 45 - READ THE CHAPTERS FIRST

Through Joseph's actions God began to deal severely with his brothers for their sin of betraying their brother years ago. When they were finally humbled, Joseph revealed himself and assured them of the good that God had brought from their evil action. The entire story is a picture of the Lord Jesus dealing with His Jewish brethren. The Jews betrayed the greatest Brother that was ever born a Jew, their own Messiah and Savior. Through **many** harsh dealings down through the years, the Lord is working with the Jews in order to fully reveal Himself to them. The full revelation of Jesus to the Jews will not take place until the Jews pass through the Tribulation and Jesus returns to earth in full glory and power. (Read Revelation 1:7 and Zechariah 12:10.) The story can also be seen as an excellent picture of how carefully the Lord deals with us in recognizing our hidden sin.

Before Israel died, he prayed and prophesied over each son. Each prophecy was fulfilled through the Word of God and history. The Lord Jesus was born as a descendant of the tribe of Judah. The scepter speaks of the rod of authority and rulership.

Once we have confessed our sin, the Lord forgives us and puts away our sin forever. Sometimes certain thoughts or circumstances cause us to remember these past sins, tempting us to feel guilty and condemned. This is what happened to Joseph's brothers after Jacob's death. Joseph was very grieved that they should bring up their sin and ask forgiveness all over again. We also can grieve the Lord by not fully accepting His grace and forgiveness.
